Where Do SALT Campers Stay?

You can choose from the following:

- Hogan Hill - A Hogan is a framed platform tent with bunk beds. These accommodations will hold up to 40 youth.
- Retreat Houses- Air Conditioned, heated retreat building with wooden bunk beds. 32 youth can stay in each building and 64 in each of our villages.
- Freedom Tree Village- A lodge within our adult retreat facility that is available to adult group leaders for a nominal extra charge.
